# G2300: INTERMEDIATE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER FUNCTIONS

<u>Course Description</u>: The G-2300 Intermediate Emergency Operations Center Functions is a 24-hour course with the goal of assisting individuals and jurisdictions who desire to develop or improve their Emergency Operation Centers (EOC). By the end of the course, students will be able to demonstrate, through activities and a Final Exam, the managerial and operational roles of the modern -day EOC as a NIMS Command and Coordination functional group operating within a Multiagency Coordination System (MACS).

This is an Elective Course in the Advanced Professional Series (APS)

Recommended Prerequisite: Recommended Prerequisites: IS-100, Introduction to the Incident Command System; IS-2200, Basic Emergency Operations Center Functions; IS-700, National Incident Management System, an Introduction; IS-800, National Response Framework, an Introduction; IS-0701, National Incident Management System Multi-Agency Coordination System Course; G 0191, Emergency Operations Center/Incident Command System Interface IS-200, Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response

**Recommended Participants:** The intended audience(s) are federal, state, tribal, territorial, local level, business and nongovernmental emergency management personnel who may be designated to support an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) within their jurisdiction or organization. The materials were developed with the assumption that audience members may have little or no actual experience as a member of an EOC Staff.
