# **G-428: CERT TRAIN THE TRAINER**

**Course Description:** This three-day course prepares students to organize and teach the CERT Basic Training Course by demonstrating instructional methods and familiarizing students with the instructional modules of the course. This course also covers considerations for developing and implementing a CERT Training Course.

**Required Prerequisites:** Registrants without a fire, rescue, or disaster preparedness background are required to have completed the standard 20-hour CERT Basic Training course or equivalent experience. Those with a fire, rescue, and/or disaster preparedness background that have not taken or taught the CERT course are required to complete the online IS-317 Introduction to Community Emergency Response Teams course available at <a href="https://training.fema.gov/is/courseoverview.aspx?code=IS-317.a">https://training.fema.gov/is/courseoverview.aspx?code=IS-317.a</a>
