

CLASSROOM L967 LOGISTICS SECTION CHIEF COURSE

Course Description: This L967 Logistics Section Chief course provides local and state-level emergency responders with a robust understanding of the duties, responsibilities, and capabilities of an effective Logistics Section Chief on an All-Hazards Incident Management Team (AHIMT). These responsibilities fall into two categories: responding to the incident and effectively fulfilling the position responsibilities of a Logistics Section Chief on an AHIMT. Exercises, simulations, discussions, and a final exam enable participants to process and apply their new knowledge.

Recommended Participants: NIMS ICS Position Specific training shall be completed by personnel who will be required to gain a certificate of training and the credentials to function in an ICS Organization, such as an IMT, as a member of the Command, General Staff or as a Unit Leader. These criteria will be verified on the student enrollment request by endorsement of the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) such as the State/Tribal Training Officer or the course manager.

Required Prerequisites: Applicants must first register via the Ohio Department of Public Safety Training Campus (PSTC) website at <https://learning.dps.ohio.gov/PSTC/>. After successfully registering on the PSTC website, the applicant will receive an email that will provide guidance to complete the FEMA FORM FF-USFA-FY-21-101 Application. Candidates must submit the application as a packet with the following six required prerequisite certificates of completion by the deadline to Pam K. Tickle at pktickle@franklincountyohio.gov for consideration to attend the course: IS-0100: Introduction to the Incident Command System (ICS), ICS 100, IS-0200: Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response, IS-0700: An Introduction to the National Incident Management System (NIMS), IS-0800: National Response Framework (NRF), An Introduction, E/L/G 0300: Intermediate Incident Command System for Expanding Incidents and E/L/G 0400 Advanced Incident Command System for Complex Incidents, ICS 400.

Applicants that we approve to attend the course will receive a **FEMA Registration Invitation Code** and guidance directing them to officially register for the course on the FEMA National Emergency Training Center (NETC) Online Admissions Application website (the applicant will only be able to view the course on the NETC Online Application website after Lisa Jones provides them the **Invitation Code**).

Course Costs: There is no charge for participants to attend this course, however, Lodging, Meals, Per Diem and all other travel expenses are the responsibility of the student or the parent organization.

Course Materials: Student Manuals and other course documents will be provided via email prior to the course start date.
