FCEM&HS Meets with Mt Air Residents

FCEM&HS joined Sharon Township Police for a special meeting with residents and elected officials in Mount Air on Wednesday, July 27th. The meeting was held to discuss flood procedures and response during the flash flood warning on June 22nd. FCEM&HS provided information on weather service products issued by the National Weather Service and the USGS river gauges. Residents were encouraged to sign up for ALERT Franklin County to receive flood notifications and other severe weather information. FCEM&HS will continue working with Sharon Township to review flood level action points and additional monitoring stations.

ALERT Franklin County Marketing Campaign

In July, FCEM&HS began working with Murphy Epson to design a county-wide marketing plan to increase public awareness and citizen registration for ALERT Franklin County. The plan will include strategies for Social Media and Facebook advertising, as well as electronic communications, media relations and an animated video. The marketing materials will be provided to all 42 jurisdictions in Franklin County to use to encourage area residents to sign up for ALERT Franklin County.
