NWS Severe Weather Spotter Training - March 5, 2016

The National Weather Service (NWS) depends in part on eyewitness information from citizens, public safety and emergency management personnel trained to recognize and report potentially life-threatening severe weather conditions. FCEM&HS and The Ohio State University Emergency Management will co-sponsor the annual Severe Weather Spotter Seminar by NWS on Saturday, March 5, 2016 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at The Fawcett Center, 2400 Olentangy River Road, Columbus. The training and parking are free and open to the public. The seminar, led by meteorologists from the NWS Forecast Office in Wilmington, Ohio, will provide specialized training on how to spot, report and prepare for tornadoes and other severe spring weather conditions in Franklin County. Trainees will gain better understanding of storm structure and how to distinguish tornadoes from look-alikes. Residents interested in the training can register before 9:00 a.m. the day of the training.



FCEMHS encourages the community to participate in the annual **Statewide Tornado Drill at 9:50 a.m. on Wednesday, March 23rd, 2016** when the Franklin County Outdoor Warning Siren System will be activated. The sirens will be a activated one time for three minutes – a longer tone than in the regular Wednesday noon tests. Franklin County experiences more tornadoes than any other county in Ohio. Designing and exercising a tornado safety plan for your home or establishment will help you respond safely in a real event.
