# ALERT Franklin County

Franklin County Emergency Management and Homeland Security launched ALERT Franklin County, a new county-wide mass notification and warning system on July 29, 2015. The state-of-the-art system will be used to alert residents about emergencies and other important community news in all 42 jurisdictions within Franklin County.

ALERT Franklin County allows residents to choose what kind of community notifications they want to receive, how they would like to receive them and the location they want to receive them for. Text message is the fastest way to receive messages. Residents can elect to receive emergency notifications about severe weather and disasters as well as location specific information regarding crime alerts, road closures, utility outages, government closings and other important community news.
